What is Student-Led Peer Mediation?

Student-Led Peer Mediation (SLPM) is a process where trained students act as neutral mediators. Students in conflict work with a trained student mediator to uncover the root causes of their disputes and <u>together</u> decide on fair ways of resolving conflict.



SLPM in schools offers the innovative opportunity to establish and improve healthy communication between families and schools. It's confidential, creating an environment of open and peaceful communication that allows for students and their surrounding community to excel.
